Percy models art on natural forms

ALBURY designer Alison Percy will host her second solo art exhibition in Albury in April.

Percy's selected works, including landscape, floral and figurative paintings and drawings, form the exhibition, *Recent Works by Alison Percy*, at Boom Boom Wine

Bar + Eatery in Amp Lane from April 19 until May 15.

Percy said she was inspired by a curiosity of her surroundings, in nature and in the human form.

Her artworks are formed using ink, soft pastel, charcoal, acrylic and watercolour onto canvas and paper.

"The work takes on a layered, reflective journey with intuitive use of mark making, fluid line and colour," Percy said.

Percy has now focused on her artwork after a career of more than three decades in graphic design, interior design consulting, account

management and tutoring at Wodonga TAFE.

She developed a love of life drawing as a visual arts student in the 1980s.

"I still see the human figure as a landscape and working with inks and watercolour represent this image well," she said.

An Artist in Conversation event will be held at Boom Boom on Tuesday, April 19, from 6pm until 8pm. The event price includes charcuterie boards and a glass of wine or beer on arrival.
